

Distribution of Student Grants under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund

Celebrity School of Beauty has been awarded funding from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) authorized by the recent Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security ("CARES") Act to provide emergency financial aid grants to students. To comply with federal requirements for the grant, the institution is disclosing the following information:

1. Celebrity School of Beauty signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students
2. The total amount of funds that the institution will have received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$173,860.
3. As of July 24, 2020 the total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is \$173,860.
4. 356 students were eligible to participate in the Federal student financial aid programs under Section 484 of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, and thus are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
5. The Department of Education defined eligible students as students who had a disruption in their education due to the COVID 19 pandemic. International students, undocumented students, and students who enrolled prior to March 13, 2020 in an online program were not eligible for funding from this grant. Only students who were eligible to receive financial aid funding were eligible for the emergency grant. Therefore, the institution identified 356 eligible students that were actively enrolled on March 13, 2020. To determine the amount of grant each student receives, the institution divided the total allocation by the number of students, thereby determining that each student is eligible for a total grant of \$488.38.
6. To receive the check, students sign an attestation statement by which, upon accepting the check, the student agrees to use the funds for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus. Eligible expenses can include food, housing, course materials, technology and other expenses included in a student's cost of attendance.
